Talk About It

Chapter 1: What on Earth Is Geography?

Where you are It is important to know your location on Earth. With your child, pretend you are giving directions to your house for someone who lives on the moon. What landforms and bodies of water are near where you live? On what hemisphere do you live? What natural resources can be found in your area?

Chapter 2: Understanding Regions

Differentiating regions The United States has many different regions. Ask your child which region you live in. What are some characteristics of your region?
